

How Advising Works in the College of Education:

Academic advisors are here to support you and connect you to resources for every aspect of your college journey. You will be assigned an academic advisor during the summer before your first term. During your first year, you will meet with your advisor once per term to check-in and plan for classes the next term. You can connect with your advisor as often as needed to discuss questions about your degree and success.

When To Check In with an Advisor:

Plan to check in with your advisor halfway through each term. You can schedule an appointment with your assigned advisor through <u>Beaver Hub</u> or find our contact information online at <u>education.oregonstate.edu/advising</u>

Prepping for an Advising Appointment:

Advisors can answer questions about your academic success and degree plan, but they can also help connect you to experience and resources across the university. To prepare for your advising appointment, we encourage you to:

Review your MyDegrees and sample degree plan.

• Use the Schedule of Classes to start exploring for the next term.

• Write down any questions.

• Consider opportunities to enhance your degree through clubs, work or volunteer experience, study abroad experiences, etc. and discuss your interests with your advisor.

Connect with a Peer Advisor

Peer advisors are college ambassadors currently pursuing one of our Education programs. You can connect with them to answer general questions about your courses, learn about resources and opportunities on campus, and what to expect from your Education program. Peer advisors are available for drop-in or scheduled appointments or via email.
